



Dear Parents

Many thanks to all those grown-ups who were able to attend the Reception and Nursery children's Christmas productions and concerts last week. The children were just fantastic and certainly not daunted performing in front of a large audience! From the many comments received, I know how much you thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to come into school and watch your superstars perform. I am sure you were as proud of the children as we were!

Celebration Assembly

When we return after our Christmas break we will be presenting awards to all of those children who have managed to come to school every day since the start of term in September. If children have managed to achieve 100% attendance, they will receive a bronze star badge which we hope they will wear very proudly on their school uniform. We hope that as many of these children as possible will gain a Silver Award (for two terms of 100% attendance) or may be even a Gold Award which is recognition for 100% attendance during the academic year. Next term, there is still a possibility for other children to gain a Bronze Award and possibly a Silver too the following term. As always, thank you for your support in ensuring that your children are in school regularly and punctually to maintain continuity in learning which is so important in these formative, early years.

As part of our Attendance Policy which is based on the Local Authority's Attendance Policy, if a child's attendance is below 90% for the Autumn Term (which equates to 14 sessions absence), school is obliged to meet with parents and carers to look at ways in which we can offer support to ensure all children can take full advantage of all that we can offer so that they don't fall behind their peers. If your child falls into this category you may receive an invitation to attend a meeting early in the new year. Please remember this is a supportive meeting, during which everyone can work together to ensure the best attendance possible for your child at school. Can I also take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that all children should be arriving punctually to start their school day entering school on the appropriate playground with their friends and not through the main entrance/office. The school day starts at 8.50am for all children and gates will close promptly at this time, registers completed and lessons will start. After these times, children will be marked as late and parents will need to bring children in through the office and sign them in late using the electronic signing in system. To help parents with multiple drop-offs, we open our gates at 8.40am and children can come into school at any point between this time and before 8.50am. For the best start to your child's day, please ensure they arrive on time.
