We have had another very busy week. I cannot believe that we are heading towards to the end of the busy

term. This week we have been sharing the story 'The Bunny who found Easter'. We have found out that Easter isn't a place, that he was actually looking for but a special occasion. A lovely story if you would like to read it at home.



In Maths this week we have been looking at doubling and learning doubling facts.

Have a look and see if you can double objects at home maybe pairing socks or doubling fruit, 2 apples and 2 apples make 4 apples, double 2 is 4. We have enjoyed learning about the Hindu Festival Holi this week. We know that Holi is the festival of colour and that some families come together to celebrate this festival.

Homework Challenges

Forest School Kit Information

Please can you Make sure that all children have gloves and a warm layer in their Forest School bag. Please can you check that your child hasn't grown out of their Forest School kit. The waterproof trousers (need to be waterproof and fit over the wellies and to the bottom of the wellies.

If you are concerned on colder days about your child's warmth, please put another layer in the bag ie thicker socks or a fleece, as it is easy to remove layers once out in the Forest School.

Forest School sessions take place in the Afternoon – so please send children into school in their PE kit-(just joggers, no shorts) not their F**orest School kit**. They will change into Forest School kits before the session so they don't get to warm.

Please could all Forest School kit listed above come in to school in a separate bag, **(pump bag, back pack)** which is **all** clearly named.
